We write to invite your participation in a restart of the popular FAMS FACULTY FAVORITES FILM SERIES. We hope for a diverse line-up of films and are open to all suggestions, and we are particularly interested in highlighting uncommon subject material, challenging artistic and intellectual perspectives, and innovative approaches.

You will be asked to submit the title of the film and three possible event dates in order of preference. We will gather the responses, assemble a series, and get back to you. Should we have more volunteers than we can fit into this 8-week run (this has been the case in the past), we will, with your permission, hold volunteers and films as possibilities for next semester, when we hope to continue the series. The survey will close on Sunday, February 18.

The last semester we ran the series was pre-Covid, when over 1,000 students, faculty, staff and community members attended and actively participated over the 14 weeks of screenings. That semester we were delighted to feature hosts from 14 different academic departments or programs, and to benefit from the diversity of approaches with which hosts introduced and discussed the films. We have long envisioned the campus cinema as a kind of commons or meeting place for interdisciplinary encounters, as well as a space where campus and community come together to embrace art and ideas. With your contributions, we will restart the series and help continue this valuable practice.
